##### From Down East and the Beaufort/Morehead City Area

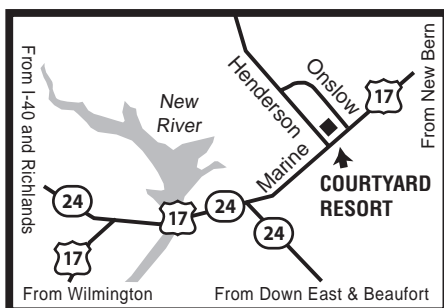
Take Highway 24 West to Jacksonville and Richlands

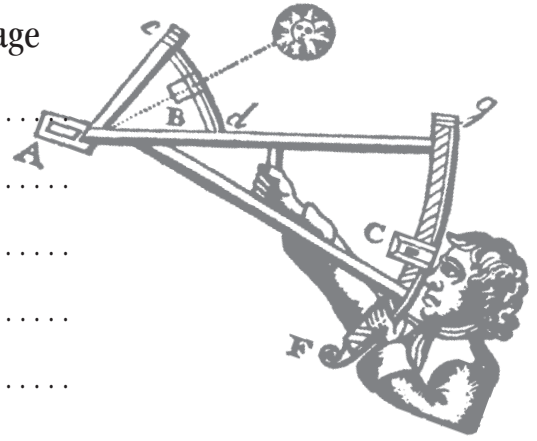
