NEW CORAL REEF MANAGEMENT GUIDE PROVIDES STRATEGIES TO CONSERVE WORLD'S CORAL REEFS

Innovative strategies to conserve the world's coral reefs are included in a new guide released today by NOAA, the Australian Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority and The World Conservation Union (IUCN). "A Reef Manager's Guide to Coral Bleaching" will provide coral reef managers with the latest scientific information on the causes of coral bleaching and new management strategies for responding to this significant threat to coral reef ecosystems.

JOB Do you like subtropical sun and ocean?
Do you like working with kids from the 5th through 12th grades?
MarineLab is seeking a FULL TIME marine science field instructor for its marine environmental education center in Key Largo, Florida. Instructors lead discussions and labs on subtropical marine topics such as seagrass, mangroves, and coral reefs, and lead snorkeling field trips via boat to investigate local marine communities in the offshore waters of Key Largo. CRESLI and the Viking Fleet are planning to offer either of the following trips from Montauk NY in early July 2007:

(a) Montauk to the Great South Channel and to Hydrographer Canyon. We would leave Montauk at 7:00 PM on July 1 and head directly to the Great South Channel (to observe pelagic birds and cetaceans). We should reach the GSC before daybreak on July 2 spend several hours there and move South to Hydrographer Canyon, reaching there by sunset. We would remain at Hydrographers searching for white-faced storm petrels, sperm whales and other shelf edge species for the entire morning and then begin our 10 hour return trip. We expect to return on July 3 at 10:30 PM.

(b) An alternative itinerary would take us directly from Montauk to Hydrographer Canyon. We would reach the canyon by daybreak on Monday and would stay in the canyon until Tuesday afternoon. At the present we are simply trying to gauge interest. If you are interested, please contact Dr. Artie Kopelman at president@cresli.org and let him know which trip would interest you. If we generate enough interest, the trip will be scheduled and reservations will be available through the CRESLI website.
